Shadow Defence Diversification Agency

1. Conference acknowledges:

- a. the defence industry is increasingly capital intensive and employment is in long-term decline:
- b. urgent attention is needed to ensure skilled, secure and well-paid employment for defence workers.

2. Conference welcomes:

- c. Jeremy Corbyn's commitment to establishing a Defence Diversification Agency 'jointly between workers, industry and government to ensure that jobs and skills are not just maintained, but also expanded';
- d. Motion 17 passed by TUC 2017 which 'calls on trade unions and the TUC to lobby the Labour Party to establish a 'shadow Defence Diversification Agency' and 'urges trades union councils, trade unions and the General Council of the TUC' to assist it work;
- e. Unite's 2018 policy conference decision is to 'provide resources to develop a defence diversification strategy' including promoting cross-sectoral work within the union, and working with other unions, the TUC and Labour Party.
- 3. Conference recognises that securing jobs for defence workers is best achieved by the establishment of a Shadow Defence Diversification Agency as part of a national industrial strategy, which must encourage workers and communities to take the lead in a broad partnership of all stakeholders.

4. Conference resolves to:

- f. encourage discussion about defence diversification at all levels of the party;
- g. work with the TUC, Unite and other unions to encourage research on defence diversification; and
- h. establish a Shadow Defence Diversification Agency as a matter of urgency.

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
